

Associate of Science to Bachelor of Science Nursing Program

A Convenient Program Tailored to Your Goals

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

To combat the nursing shortage in Central Florida, the UCF College of Nursing has partnered with Seminole Community College (SCC) to provide an alternative nursing opportunity for those UCF students not admitted to our limited-access nursing program and to SCC students wishing to pursue their B.S.N. at UCF. This program allows academically talented students to attend a community college to earn their associate's degree while simultaneously attending UCF for their Bachelor of Science in nursing.

Qualified students will enroll in an A.S. program in nursing and start course work at UCF immediately. Each semester will split course work between the A.S.N. and B.S.N. degrees—eight to 10 credits at SCC and two to nine credits at UCF. After five semesters, students earn their A.S. in nursing, are eligible to take the NCLEX exam and, once licensed, practice as an RN. After one additional semester of full-time or two semesters of part-time study, students will complete their B.S. in nursing.

The A.S. to B.S.N. program also allows qualified community college students who have completed their A.A. degrees or who have met at least 18 credits of general education course requirements to begin upper-level course study earlier, provided they have finished their nursing prerequisites.



ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Eligible for admission to UCF and to the UCF College of Nursing
- Admission to SCC's nursing program (Day or Evening)
- Completion of A.A. degree or met UCF's general education component
- Completion of Sociology (SYG 2000), Statistics (STA 2023), Chemistry (CHM 1032C)
- Completion of two years of same foreign language from high school or college
- Overall GPA of 2.8

UCF classes during the first five semesters will be taught at SCC Altamonte Springs or via the Web. Upon completion of the A.S.N., students will complete their remaining UCF courses on the Web.
